THANK YOU for registering your youth for Deep Impact 2017. Deep Impact, over the years, has been a catalyst for others to come to know Jesus Christ, and this year will be no different. Your youth and adult leaders will be able to have a part in carrying out the Great Commission. Parent Meeting Guide

The following information is a guide to help you provide parents of your students all the information they need to send their students to Deep Impact. Understand this is simply a guide and can be modified to fit your particular situation.

Introduction and Prayer

5 minutes

What is Deep Impact? Spend a few minutes explaining what Deep Impact is to your parents so they will know how to pray for and prepare their student to go.

Deep Impact Video

5 minutes

This video will give your parents and students a visual of what to expect. This can be found at: <http://www.baptistsonmission.org/Camps/Deep-Impact>

Forms (medical, covenant, T-shirt and mission preference)

15 minutes

It is good to have parents complete these forms while you have them together at this meeting.

What to Bring

10 minutes

It is a good idea to make a copy of the "What to Bring" page for every parent. There are no laundry facilities. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU COVER THE DRESS CODE WITH EVERY PARENT AND STUDENT!

Sample Daily Schedule

5 minutes

Go over the sample schedule so that students know what to expect and parents know how to pray for their students.

Mission Team Experience

5 minutes

Take time to explain that your students will be placed on mission teams according to their mission preference. They will work with youth from other churches. Your adult leaders will also be placed on a mission team for the week.

Church's Expectations

10 minutes

While Deep Impact is a pre-packaged mission week, it is important for you to set goals and expectations for the week. This is the time to discuss the timeline for money due, your expectations of students on mission, and other elements important to success.

Questions and Answers

5-10 minutes

Take the last few minutes to answer any questions still left unresolved.

Deep Impact Payment Policies - 2017

North Carolina Deep Impact Mission Weeks in Boone, Stokes/Forsyth, Rockingham and Beulaville are \$210 per person. Shelby and Red Springs are \$225 per person. Philadelphia is \$350 per person. Included in the cost per person is: lodging, meals, program, materials/supplies, t-shirt, and insurance. All per person fees for Deep Impact are paid directly to NC Baptist Men. **A \$75 per person non-refundable deposit is due within 2 weeks of registration. Philadelphia per person non-refundable deposit is \$150.** If deposit is not received within 2 weeks every effort will be made to contact youth leader to make payment. In the event deposit payment is not made, registration will be voided. If you need to wait until a new budget year to pay the deposit, please contact Tom Beam at 1.800.395.5102, ext. 5626.

North Carolina Deep Impact Mini Weeks are \$115 per person. Included in the cost per person is: lodging, meals, program, materials/supplies, t-shirt, and insurance. All \$115 per person of the Deep Impact fees is paid directly to NC Baptist Men. **A \$50 per person non-refundable deposit is due within 2 weeks of registration.** If deposit is not received within 2 weeks every effort will be made to contact youth leader to make payment. In the event deposit payment is not made, registration will be voided.

- The remaining balance per person is due to the NC Baptist Men office no later than three weeks before your arrival at Deep Impact. The Deep Impact fee can be applied to another person. No fees are refundable after the balance due date except in the event of serious illness or death in the immediate family.
- If a group registers within three weeks of camp date (with available space) complete non-refundable payment per person must accompany registration.
- Additions can be made at any time as long as space is available.
- Groups are allowed three drops from the registered total prior to the final payment due date. The deposits for these drops will apply to the final balance.
- All drops in excess of the three allowed prior to the final payment due date result in the forfeiture of those deposits.
- All drops after the final payment date will result in forfeiture of those deposits and incur an additional \$100 late drop charge for each drop.
- If the entire group cancels before the final payment due date, all deposits will be forfeited.
- If the entire group cancels after final payment is due, all deposits are forfeited and the late drop fee of \$75 is assessed for each registered participant.
- Cancellations must be made in writing via mail, e-mail, or fax.
- When you pay the entire amount by April 15, your youth leader comes for free.

The North Carolina Deep Impact Mission Week to Honduras is \$1,650 per person and to Bahamas is \$1,200 per person. Included in the cost per person is: airline ticket, lodging, meals, in country transportation, program, materials/supplies, t-shirt, insurance. Not included are costs related to passport, immunizations and meals in-route. **Deposit of \$250 per person for Honduras and Bahamas must be received within 2 weeks of registration.** The remaining balance per person will be paid in increments set up by NCBM. If a cancellation occurs all moneys will be refunded up until the time airline tickets and/or lodging reservations have been confirmed.

(This process will be the same when paying final balance)

A word about Chaperones

1. A good rule of thumb for all Youth and Children's workers is that there are always at least two non-related screened adults present to supervise.
2. All chaperones with youth on a Deep Impact trip must be 21 years of age or older and submit to a background check. On international mission trips we recommend chaperones be 25 years of age and older.
3. Deep Impact depends on adult chaperons for a variety of reasons. One is to make sure all youth from your church enjoy their experience and have adult supervision. Another is to make sure we have enough adult leadership for our mission projects. With this in mind we would like to suggest a ratio of 2 adults for the first 7 youth same gender and then 1 more for each 7 over 14 youth. If you have less than 5 youth of either gender then we will allow you to have 1 adult per gender. If this is the case, adults will only be allowed to lodge in the same room as the youth when more than one other youth is present. **IF YOU CAN BRING 2 ADULTS PER GENDER EVEN AT 5 YOUTH AND UNDER IN NUMBER, PLEASE CONSIDER DOING SO.** When having difficulty securing adult chaperons please consider having adults split time during the week.
4. A background check will be required for all persons age 18+ (youth and adults) seeking to work with minors on a mission project. (see pg. 19)
5. When overnight trips are necessary, the following conditions must be met: No adult may room with a minor or group of minors except in situations where multiple single/twin bed/bunk type lodging is present such as barracks or cabins. In these cases, two or more screened adults may share lodging with a group of minors. No adult may sleep in the same bed as a minor at any time. In all situations, supervising adults must be of the same gender as the minors they are supervising.

Reminder: If both youth boys and girls are on a trip, then both male and female adult chaperones are to be present as well.

Several new Bibles to be given away at mission sites

IMPORTANT!!! Please READ to all your students and parents!

Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs and weapons of any kind are not permitted on the Deep Impact campuses or mission sites. Pocketknives are considered weapons and can only be carried at the construction sites if needed. Electronic devices are discouraged for the week and are not allowed to be used during worship or while working on the mission sites. Cell phone use on the mission sites is not allowed by any youth and only allowed by adults for emergency use only. Any electronic device or other valuable is brought at the risk of the person bringing the property. North Carolina Baptist Men will not be responsible for the damage, loss or theft of any personal property brought to Deep Impact.



Important Safety Information Concerning 15 Passenger Vans

There is an increased risk of accidents for using older model 15 passenger vans when people or weight of any kind are placed in the rear seat (or in the area of the rear seat, for those vans which have had the rear seat removed). Weight in this (extended) area of the van has been found to make the vehicle unstable in the event of an emergency (such as when the driver turns sharply in order to avoid an accident). Because of this increased risk of accidents involving 15 passenger vans due to this weight distribution problem, Deep Impact and Baptists On Mission/North Carolina Baptist Men will not send mission teams out assigning participants to ride in the back seat of 15 passenger vans. Furthermore, this space (in the back seat area of the van) is not to be used by our teams to transport equipment, supplies, or anything else that would add weight to this area of the van. Therefore, the maximum number of people that we will assign to any 15 passenger van will be 11 participants. In addition, all drivers will be required to see that all participants that are traveling in their vehicles wear seat belts. **If you are using a 15 passenger van (or vans) to transport your group to Deep Impact this year please make sure that you provide enough transportation space for the total number in the group that you bring, counting only 11 passengers per van.** This will insure that we have enough drivers and transportation space for all participants to travel to and from their Deep Impact Missions Sites. We realize that this may require your group to bring more vehicles than you originally planned. We apologize for this inconvenience but we cannot yield to convenience by placing your students and chaperones at risk.

Deep Impact Dress Code

Youth Leader: Please make sure you read the following to each student, his or her parent(s), and all adult leaders participating in Deep Impact Youth Mission Weeks:

Deep Impact Youth Mission Weeks are designed to advance the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the lives of those who attend and those who are reached through the mission projects. Following the dress code will create an atmosphere in which people are talking about a mission's impact rather than about the clothes we are wearing. To ensure we do our best to make Deep Impact a great experience for everyone we require that the guidelines outlined below be followed as appropriate dress for the week beginning on arrival at the Deep Impact location.

- Do not wear T-shirts or other clothing with offensive language, advertisements or pictures.
- Short shorts will not be permitted any time during the Deep Impact week. See picture below of what is permitted and what is not. Shorts/skirt length will be below mid-thigh being closer to the knees. This includes skirts. All pants, shorts and skirts should be worn up on the waist as well.
- Do not wear cutoffs, or any type of sleeveless shirt (this includes factory made sleeveless shirts as well). Low cut shirts are also prohibited.
- Long pants that have rips and/or holes in inappropriate places will not be allowed.
- No tight fitting apparel (i.e. tight dresses, mini-skirts, compression pants, etc.) is permitted at any time. No clothing will be permitted that exposes your midriff area.
- If there is an opportunity at your Deep Impact location to swim and the venue is arranged by NC Baptist Men, bikinis are not allowed. Please bring only one-piece swim suits or modest two-piece suits. Modest is a tankini type swimsuit where the top and bottom pieces are touching. Male suits are to be the board short type of swimwear worn up on the hips, not below the hips.
- Shoes must be worn in the dining area.
- Students on all project sites must wear covered shoes (athletic or work boots). Open toe shoes, flip flops, etc. are ok around lodging.
- Please remember to monitor your group so others will not feel led to complain to us.

A dress code issue will be handled in the following manner:

- The Deep Impact Director, Assistant Directors and/or Coordinator will take the issue to the group leader. The group leader will then handle the situation with their student.
- Repeated violations of the dress code or failure to comply after action is taken may result in a dismissal from the Deep Impact campus.

The Deep Impact staff relies heavily on youth group leaders to help make a mission week successful. Please do your part to make sure the above guidelines are followed without exception.

Mission Team Structure

Mission Projects

Local churches, associations and NC Baptist Men generate mission projects. Students and their leaders from participating churches across North Carolina complete the mission projects. To do this successfully we combine the efforts of paid summer staff, dedicated volunteers and youth leaders who bring their youth to Deep Impact. The following will help you understand the flow of how mission projects are done successfully and how you can help make this the best experience possible for your group.

Training

It is important to understand the training that will take place prior to your group going out on the mission sites during Deep Impact. To make this training possible and effective we need youth leaders to agree to fill two important positions on each team. The Team Leader and Team Motivator positions are described below. Please indicate on the Team Roster form who from your group is willing to fill these positions. Remember all adult leaders will serve on a team.

ALL ADULTS MUST BE CHOOSE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING POSITIONS on a mission project team:

Team Leader

The Team Leader from each mission team will be the key person on each team to make sure the mission project is completed. The Team Leader will be the key person of contact to and from the Deep Impact staff. The Team Leader will be the key contact person on the mission site and will supervise the site and the students and other leaders on the site.

Team Motivator

The Team Motivator for each mission team will be the care person for the students. The Team Motivator will keep up with the medical forms, make sure the team has its lunches, build and keep morale, and care for the general well-being of the team. They will encourage students to stay involved with their mission team.

ALL ADULTS AND YOUTH MUST CHOOSE FROM THE FOLLOWING FOR THEIR MISSION PROJECT ASSIGNMENTS

Children's Ministries – Participants will work with children in a variety of possible settings. The main purpose of these ministries is to build relationships with the children and have the opportunity to share the love of Christ with the children. Possible activities include Bible stories, crafts, games, and other fun activities.

Sports and Recreation Ministries – Participants will use sports and recreation to reach people in the community with the Gospel. Possible activities include pickup games, working in recreation centers and children's centers and church sponsored sports camps.

Community Outreach – Participants will use acts of kindness to earn the opportunity to share the Gospel with people in the community. Possible activities include free laundry, light bulb handouts, water distribution, car washes, and public park ministries.

Construction, Painting and Landscaping – Participants will work in areas of construction, painting, and landscaping to help someone in need. Possible activities include building wheelchair ramps, sheetrock, painting homes, clearing bushes, mowing yards, and debris cleanup.

Senior Adult Ministries – Participants will work with senior adults in the Deep Impact community. Possible activities include working in nursing homes, senior centers, helping in senior adult's homes (cleaning, landscaping), and other life enrichment activities. These projects may include working with special needs adults.
