PROJECTS in WYOMING:

CAMP COOK TEAMS

- RM18-011** Camp Cook Team Casper, Wyoming
One team of 10-14 volunteers is needed to cook for campers who are attending camp (Child Evangelism Fellowship Week 1 July 30-August3). Meals will be planned and food purchased by the camp director. Team will be responsible for all prep, cooking, serving and clean up after each meal. The day begins early and is finished by around 7:00 p.m. Most days will have a couple hours to rest and relax in between. Volunteers with cooking skills and able to lift heavy pots and pans are needed. Team will need to provide their own transportation. Housing will be provided for the team while at camp. Food will be provided while camp is in session and team is cooking for campers. **Note:** Team will be responsible for conducting professional background checks on all team members over the age of 18. Team leaders will be sent information from NC Baptist Men concerning options for this.

- RM18-017a** Renovation of Church Building Douglas, Wyoming
Two teams of 8-12 are needed to assist a new church plant in the renovation of an older church building. The log building has several exterior issues. One project is to fill a multitude of cracks that have developed in the exterior siding. Church planter and church member have learned of (and tested) an effective way of "caulking" the cracks. Entry way of building also need to have old ceiling tiles and paneling stripped and newly sheet rocked and finished. There are several other projects that are needed as well, and plenty to keep a team busy. Congregation has limited funds and ask that team bring with them \$1000-2000 to help with materials cost if at all possible. Team can stay at the existing church building, which has a kitchen for team's use and a shower. Teams could drive, or fly into either Casper or Denver. If flying, team will need to rent vehicles.

PROJECTS in MONTANA

RM18 -016a Community Service/Construction/Kid's Camps Livingston, Montana
Teams of 10-16 are needed to serve with a church planter and family to reach out to their community in a variety of ways. Some projects will be at local schools, local parks, and other "public" areas. This may involve painting, construction of picnic tables, serving at local soup kitchen, and other places where volunteers are needed. This kind of activity helps the church planter build important relationships with community leaders and creates visibility for the church. Teams may also do several construction/renovation projects in a new church building that has recently been acquired. This could involve building of playground area, replacement of siding, converting a garage into office space, roofing, decking, and the remodel of fellowship hall area. Finally, according to availability, some teams may lead kid's camps in local parks. Requestor will talk with team leader about renting one of several vacation rental homes that are available in the area (from \$18-35 per person per night), which would have showers and kitchen facility for team's use. Teams arrive on Saturday and depart on Friday throughout the summer – late May to early August. **Note:** Teams who plan to do children's ministry will be responsible for conducting professional background checks on all team members over the age of 18. Team leaders will be sent information from NCBM concerning options for this.
