- **Agriculture Missions: Gardens as a Mission Tool** – Session 1 (Rm 3224).....Tim Etheridge
Gardens can be a way of involving church or association members in mission activities close to home. This type of project can provide fresh vegetables which can be used as a ministry to those in need.
- **Agriculture Missions International** – Session 2 (Rm 3224).....Tim Etheridge
Ag Missions is trying to partner with other ministries outside the United States which have agricultural needs. We will discuss our current involvement with international mission partnerships.
- **Aviation Missions** – Sessions 1 & 3 (Rm 3218) Phillip Plemmons
This session is for all people interested in using their gifts of evangelism and compassion to serve others through aviation and **other means** of transportation, i.e. Angel Flights, Prayer Flights, Youth Flying, Earth Angels etc.

- **International: Kenya** – Sessions 1, 2, 3 (Rm 3317) Gene Kirby
Mission teams are making a great impact in the African nation of Kenya. In the Houses of Hope project, teams build four houses in four days for families in need as part of a church planting effort. House-to-house evangelism, children's ministry, and other evangelistic efforts are also a part of this mission. You are needed in Kenya!
- **International: Least of These Projects – Reclaiming Haiti** – Sessions 1 & 3 (Rm 4204) Richard Weeks / Rene Romil
Would you like to make an eternal impact in Haiti and help reclaim a nation from the grip of Voodoo? Rene Romil began his ministry after the 2010 earthquake and has built a school that currently has 150 students. He is also developing pastors and planting churches in rural communities. Come learn how you can help.

Come hear about how you and your team can share the love of Christ in gypsy communities in Central and Eastern Europe. Teams are needed to host VBS, evangelistic services, home visits, medical and dental clinics and English Bible Camps.
